#### Abstract

Article 1 Voting Section 1. A majority of the vote is needed to pass the motion.


Article 11

## Committees

Section 1. The Executive Committee will establish standing committees such as the Ways and Means Committee and the Publicity and Poster Committee. Volunteers will establish the formation of short-term committees.

## Article III

## Elections

Section 1. New officer elections will take place thefirst meeting during the month of May.
Section 2. In order to be elected into office eachofficer must have a majority vote. If a majority is not obtained, there shall be a re-vote or consider using both candidates.
Section 3. Students may be self-nominated or nomiated others who are willing and able to accept the nomination.
Section 4. Students running for office must fill at a form in order to run for office. The student and parent/guardian must sign this form.

Article 1V
Vacated Office

Section 1. If for some reason during the course ofthe year an office needs to be filled, the Executive Committee will make the nomination or ask the group for a nomination. A majority vote is required.

Article V
MEETINGS
Section 1. The Executive Committee will meet once/twice during the week of the slated meeting. Other meetings may be called as needed. Section 2. MEETINGS ARE MANDATORY. If you have missed three unexcused meetings you will be dismissed. An unexcused meeting is any meeting where you fail to let the officers or advisor know, in writing, prior to the meeting that you would not be able to be there. You must also give the reason. In an emergency, if you are absent from a meeting, but in attendance at school that day, you are required to see the Chapter Advisor and give an explanation to her by 3:30.Give her a written note
or email. The Executive Committee will vote on whether it is excused or not. If your absence is excused and you continue to abuse the system you will be on probation and may be banned from future activities.

Section 3. Make sure you are on time to the meetigs. Roll call is taken at the beginning of the meeting. If you should happen to come in latet is vour responsibility to personally tell the secretary to put your name on the roll. If you do not, you will be counted as absent. We only meet two to three times per month so there is really no reason to miss or be late.
Section 4. You will be counted tardy at 7:30 a.m. Two tardies will count as one unexcused absence. To appeal the tardy we use the same procedure as in Section 2 above.
Section 5. All chapter projects and activities reqire your participation unless otherwise stated.

Section 6. After two unexcused absences, the parets and students will receive a letter of warning or phone call from the Chapter Advisor.

## Selection of Members

Section 1. The student's academic records will be reviewed. The academic requirement is a 3.7 cumulative grade point average on a scale of 4.0 (that is over an A- average). The student must have a 3.7 average for the current fall semester. It must be maintained through tio grade.

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Section 2. If the student is enrolled in 7th gradeAlgebra 1 their grade is weighted $2 / 3$; if the student is in 8 th grade Geometry their grade is weighted $2 / 3$; if the student is in 8th grade Algebra 1, Spanish, Biology, Advanced Digital Communications, or Advanced Art their grade in the class will be weighted $1 / 3$. Ex.- If the student is in Geometry and has a "B" then their grade (for gpa purposes, not in gradebook) will be raised to "A-"
Section 3. All candidates must be enrolled in the regular academic program or honors program.
$7^{\text {th }}$ algebra will be weighted (raised) $2 / 3$ letter. If the grade is a B, it becomes a A-, a B+ becomes an A. An A is 4pts.
Section 4. All seventh grade students who meet academic requirements, and are selected by the faculty council, will be notified after the first semester grades come out.
Section 5. For further consideration each studentmust complete a Student
Activity Form. And This form must be turned into the Chapter Advisor within a week of the day it was handed out. Each student must be involved in at least two activities. Failure to turn in the activity form with your name on it, on time will automatically remove the student's name from the selection process.
Section 6. All faculty members, as well as the librarian, guidance counselors and athletic director, will be given aconfidential evaluation
form to be filled out on each student who is eligible. Teachers will have one week to complete their evaluation forms. These forms are confidential
and will be viewed only by the faculty council.
Section 7. The faculty council will review studentdiscipline files, tardies and attendance files.
Section 8. The five members of the faculty council will make the final selections. Candidates receiving amajority vote will be inducted into the chapter in the spring. The advisor and assistant advisor do notrote. Section 9. A student must have been in attendanceat this school for the equivalence of one semester.
Section 10. The teacher selection committee, (faculty council), will remain confidential.

## Article V11

## Duties of Officers

## Section 1. President:

*Meets with the advisor and officers to discuss and prepare agenda.
*Checks to see that all participants for the meetings are notified.
*Conducts meetings according to parliamentary procedure.
*Maintains discussion to relevant items on the agenda
*Moves the group to decisions on recommendations
*Seeks recommendations from persons or committees responsible for specific functions or activities.
*Delegate's responsibilities to appropriate officers and committees.
*Develops tentative agenda, date, and place for the next meeting.

## Section 2. Vice President:

*Arranges for the meeting place and the physical setting of the room.
*Take the place of the president if absent
*Sends written reports to the Daily Journal, CPN and school newsletter each month. Written and photos.

## Section 3. Secretary:

*Announces all meetings, notifies members of places and times, distributes copies of minutes to administration and officers.
*Takes attendance quickly and efficiently by use of sign-in sheet and keeps permanent record
*reports attendance to Mrs. Liffick after meeting.
*Records each motion
*Presents/reads incoming mail to the organization
*Writes minutes in concise and clear sentences.
*Duplicates minutes and posts in cafeteria. Gives copies to advisor, officers and administration.
*Checks with the absent members to inform them and to check on reasons for absence.
*Writes letters of request, praise, regret or apology, thank you notes invitations, congratulations, and commendations.
*Writes articles for the school newsletter

## Section 4. Treasurer:

*Maintain on paper a financial record of all expenditures and income
*Obtains from the school treasurer, a financial report for each meeting.
*Provides the organization with periodic financial reports.

## Dismissal


#### Abstract

Section 1. Members are liable for dismissal if they do not maintain the standards of scholarship, leadership, service, character, and citizenship that were used as a basis for their selection. Section 2. Members are allowed limited warning durng their membership, but in the case of a flagrant violation of school rules or civil laws, a warning is not required. A student who is dismissed or resigns may never again become a NJHS member. They are still eligible for National Honor Society in High School.


Section 3. Cheating is something that is not looked upon as something that a NJHS student should be involved in. If a NJHS student is caught or involved in cheating they will be put onprobation. If that student is caught again they will be dismissed from NJHS (not necessarily a behavioral referral).
Section 4. After a student causes a major disruptin their name shall come before the faculty council for evaluation and discipline. Each time inappropriate behavior is observedthe chapter advisor or secretary will inform the errant member in writing or by phone, of the nature of the violation, the time period given for improvement, and possible consequences of non-improvement. If the faculty council decides that dismissal maybe warranted, the member is allowed to present his or her case before the council.
Section 5. Receiving a behavioral referral will put you on social probation. Receiving two referrals will result in you being brought before the executive committee and the faculty council for probable dismissal.
Section 6. After receiving a behavioral referral,the parent and student will receive a letter of warning or phone call from the Chapter Advisor.

> Rules of Order

Section 1.Meetings will be conducted according toBasic Parliamentary
Rules. Robert's Rules of order
Section 2. All decisions are reached through motions (formal statements given to the group for consideration and vote). Any member may make a motion. It must be seconded to show that at least two people are interested in the proposal. The presiding officer then states the question (repeats the motion in brief, clear language). Consider only student business, other stuff is out of order. Members who wish to discuss the motion ask for recognition from the clair.
